## **BURLINGTON SCHOOL DISTRICT** A 5: NON-DISCRIMINATION IN VOCATIONAL EDUCATION PROGRAMS

## **Former Policy ACAF**

It is the intent of the Burlington Board of School Commissioners that the Board and its employees will not deny any student or group of students an equal opportunity to benefit from vocational education on the basis of race, color, national origin, sex or disability. This policy supplements the Board's other non-discrimination policies, and is not intended to detract from or decrease the effect of those policies. This policy applies to the distribution of funds for, and access and admission to, vocational education programs.

The District will not restrict the admission of applicants for the vocational education program who are members of a national origin minority with limited English language skills, because their ability to benefit and participate in the program is less than students whose primary language is English.

Disabled students will not be denied access to vocational education programs because of architectural or equipment barriers, or because employment opportunities in any occupation or profession may be more limited for disabled persons than for non-disabled persons.
