# Lease with Owners of Macy's

- Finalizing lease agreement
  - 3.5 years
  - \$1.9M per year
  - \$3.5M fit up cost
- Governor Scott's team developing supports for BSD
- Air quality results this Friday
  - Agencies do not believe results will impact occupancy
- Construction scheduled to begin December 15 and be completed February 22
- Start date is early March



# **BHS Long and Short-Term Plans**

- Edmunds on Wednesdays
- Remote Learning Monday, Thursday, Friday
- Tuesday is now asynchronous day
- Seahorse Engagement Center is open
  - Counseling
  - Social Emotional Support
  - Special Education and English Language Learning Services
  - Tutoring
- BHS team working with architects to guide Macy's renovation project



## **School Operations During COVID**

- Staff across all schools have been an example for the state and country
  - Commitment to students and families
  - Social-emotional well-being
  - Teaching and Learning
  - Excellent teacher attendance
- Community and families have made schools safe/supported



## **FY22 Baseline Budget Projections**

- FY22 Baseline Budget Projection = \$96,585,870
  - \$5,060,582 increase from FY21
- Tax Commissioner's Dec. 1 letter projects **statewide average tax increase of 9%** for school spending growth in 3-5% range
  - State Ed Fund revenues are down and statewide needs up
- Without changes we would see a 13% tax increase; BSD committed to lowering that tax impact
  - Exploring use of surplus funding from FY21 (due to COVID)
  - Seeking support from Governor and Legislature for BHS/BTC
  - Reviewing current programs for efficiencies
- Budget development continues in December and January
  - Finance Committee meeting this Thursday, December 10
  - Board meeting Tuesday, December 15
- Board Decision in January
