

Public Plan for ARP ESSER Spending

Purpose

Purpose of ESSER Funds

ESSER funds are intended to "prepare for, prevent and respond" to COVID-19 and there is a broad, but definitive <u>list of allowable costs</u> that SU/SDs must follow. The US Department of Education states that these funds are intended, "to help safely reopen and sustain the safe operation of schools and address the impact of the coronavirus pandemic on the nation's students," with a specific emphasis on meeting the needs of underserved student groups and those most significantly impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic.

Plan for Meaningful Consultation and Stakeholder Engagement

BSD has continually worked to keep the community informed about COVID-related issues, including implementation of recovery efforts. (Copies of all communications to the community are posted on the <u>COVID-19 Recovery Plan webpage</u>.)

In the Summer of 2021, school staff and District leaders began participating in recovery workgroups. These workgroups provided key input toward developing the plan and feedback throughout the planning process and some have continued to occasionally meet.

In the fall of 2021, we invited all community members to provide input on the BSD Recovery Plan by completing a survey, which was completed by 138 community members. BSD staff made an extra effort to reach marginalized populations with the survey; our multilingual liaisons translated questions and input responses for families, our homeless liaison sought input from families we serve, our student support services team shared the survey with families of students with 504 Plans and IEPs, and we distributed the survey to our partner programs and the Department of Children and Family Services.

Because BSD has was beginning the process of creating a new, five-year strategic plan during this same time period, the input of a coalition of community stakeholders gathered for the strategic plan also informed planning for the use of ESSER funds. The completed Recovery Plan is posted on the BSD website, where there is also a form that anyone can use to provide additional feedback as the process continues. BSD will continue to reach out to the community as our plans are refined and implemented.
